The display for ECLSTS at the York fairgrounds on March 26-28 was a huge success! No project of this enormity could be completed without the untiring efforts of dedicated club members. The layout consisted of an 18' x 30' plot in the middle of the vestibule hence the display was visited by thousands of visitors to the show. Numerous individuals indicated interest in the club activity and inquired about joining SVGRS.

The chairman of the show (Jake Midour and his committee members), presented a showy display which drew many comments of commendation. Other clubs with layouts at the fair frequented our display with awe. They were impressed with the complexity, sound effects and animation. Many commented that they were impressed with the beauty of the mixture of trains, buildings, shrubs, and flowers. The theme of the display was life at the turn of the century, including a complete saw mill, grist mill, and of course "Thomas the Tank Engine".

Set up was March 25th with twenty five (25) volunteers present. Tear down took but two (2) hours. Volunteers for monitoring the layout provided continuous coverage. A box lunch was provided by the "Ladies of the Club" providing nourishment to the hard working men as they toiled on the railroad.

Five (5) trains operated simultaneously giving all a chance to view "Garden Railroading" at its finest. The two (2) track Lift Bridge could be raised permitting a ferry boat to pass underneath. The trains were programmed to halt near the edge of the bridge when the it was raised. The Grist Mill was powered by water that flowed on the sluice above the water wheel. The beauty of a water-powered wheel is a long lost item of antiquity. At the edge of the mill was a pond from which the water was re-circulated. The sawmill was a complete unit taking the log in the pond at the edge of the mill up the conveyor to the large circular saw, cutting the log into boards then conveying them to the "saw yard" for stacking.

Constant activity held the interest of the young and old alike.

No project is complete without a breakdown. At the start of the day the power supply malfunctioned. All were aghast that we had trains with no power! Bridgewerks stepped forward and loaned our club sufficient power sources to ensure continued functioning of all display units including engines and of course our bridge. Many thanks to Bridgewerks, for their generosity. It is to be noted the company is repairing our power supply at NO COST.

Special thanks to Mike Oberdick for his modification of the bridge provided by club member Joseph McGowen, Mike gave the bridge the professional glow. SVGRS Meeting Minutes 12 Mar 2009

Vice President called the meeting to order at 7:25

Officers Present: Turk Russell, Jeff Shubert, Dave Watts

Membership present: 26

The vice president presided over the meeting in the absence of the president Tom McCloud

The secretary presented the minutes from the 6 November 08 meeting to the membership to read and make comments or corrections to the minutes. No comments or corrections were made. A motion was made by Jeffery Johnsbaugh to accept the minutes and was second by Barry McNew. Membership voted with 100% to accept. Dave reminded the members that the minutes will be published in the clubs newsletter and to help speed the meeting along copies will be made available to read prior to start of the meeting.
