

Barry had 3 trains running on his large scale layout. Barry's layout covers the entire width of the back of his house. His trains are primarily powered by RCS battery control.





Bachmann trains will introduce their first trolley. The trolley will be produced in 1:29 scale. Bachmann Industries is trying to keep pace with others such as Aristocraft and Hartland Trains. Both of these manufacturers currently offer this type of loco. Bachmann's version should be a higher end version. We will have to wait and see.

The Bachmann version is to have the following specifications:

- DCC ready with factory-installed 21-pin and 8-pin sockets for DCC decoder installation of your choice.
- Can be operated on track power or overhead wire (trolley wheel compatible with LGB overhead wire)
- Sound ready with factory-installed speaker
- Precision can motor.
- Connects power to all Code 332 track with screw clamps.
- For indoor and outdoor use.
- LED headlight and rear stop light
- Interior lighting
- Manually operated front and rear bi-fold doors
- Painted interior with seats
- Photo-etched brass safety screen per prototype

The unit is projected to ship October of 2013



Central of Georgia Railway

Oglethorpe square is typical of the 23 squares spread across the historical district.

Our daughter's gymnastics has taken us all over the country and this year we were fortunate enough to travel to Savannah Georgia in the last week of June. The schedule is pretty tight with competition, but after I realized a major railroad museum was within walking distance of our hotel, I managed to find a morning we could visit.

In its day, this was massive construction and repair facility for the Central of Georgia Railway. With original construction started in 1835, and many additions in the years to follow, it became one of the largest facilities in the South. Unfortunately time and hurricanes have taken their toll.



Much of the roundhouse is open to visitors.

The large roundhouse and many of the building remain, but it's largely a shell of what it

once was. Still they have a fair collection of equipment and small engines.



This small 0-4-0 tank engine is used to run short excursions.

Weekly they get a small tank engine steamed up and give short rides on what is now a pretty limited property. We didn't ride the train, but we did tour two Central of Georgia business cars which were rather well restored.



It's always nice to see some new trains, big or small. If you find yourself in Savannah, check it out!



Union Pacific Railroad Acquires Big Boy Locomotive No. 4014

Railroad Plans to Restore One of the Largest Steam Locomotives Ever Built Submitted by: Jeff Shubert



Union Pacific No. 4014 as it sits today at the on the grounds of the Los Angeles County Fairgrounds in Pomona, California.

Omaha, Neb., July 23, 2013 – Union Pacific Railroad today announced it reached an agreement with the Southern California Chapter - Railway & Locomotive Historical Society in Pomona, Calif., to transfer ownership of one of the world's largest steam locomotives, Big Boy No. 4014, back to Union Pacific.

Union Pacific plans to relocate No. 4014 to Cheyenne, Wyo., where Union Pacific's Heritage Fleet Operations team will work to restore it to operating condition. Details regarding those efforts will be made public at a later date.

Union Pacific donated No. 4014 to the historical society December 7, 1961. The locomotive arrived January 8, 1962, at its current display location at the Rail Giants Train Museum in Pomona.

No other railroad has retained its historical equipment or honored its American roots like Union Pacific.

"Our steam locomotive program is a source of great pride to Union Pacific employees past and present," said Ed Dickens, senior manager - Union Pacific Heritage Operations. "We are very excited about the opportunity to bring history to life by restoring No. 4014."







Elaine Silets is a train lover like no other. Not only did she make a career out of building model train displays but her expansive estate is homage to the locomotive. And over the weekend, Silets did something she does but once per year: she opened up her gardens to the public and something like 6,000 curious train lovers descended on her home.

Elaine Silets opens her renowned North Barrington, Illinois estate for public viewing just once per year

Silets' Glorée & Tryumfant Garden Railway includes 6,000 square feet of gardens, waterfalls, lakes, trestles, bridges, replica cityscapes and pastoral vignettes

With10 acres of gardens, waterfalls, lakes, trestles, bridges, and replica towns and pastoral scenes, her Glorée & Tryumfant Garden Railway in North Barrington, Illinois, it's no wonder they call her the Train Lady.



Silets began her new life as the Train Lady after her beloved late husband Harvey's law career took off, leaving her in search of a hobby. That hobby became Huff & Puff Industries, a company that designs and manufactures model railroads for home and garden displays. Huff & Puff's work has been seen in the Nieman Marcus Christmas book, in the lobby of Chicago's Hancock Center, and in Tiffany & Co. window displays. The half-inch G-scale trains ply a Japanese water garden with waterfalls, a pond garden, rose gardens, a Snoopy topiary built especially for Silets' grandsons, and other floral landscapes.




Also open to the day's visitors was the private train museum on Silets' property. The Harvey M. Silets Memorial museum was built in honor of the Train Lady's husband, a famous attorney who once represented Jimmy Hoffa. The museum is a scaled down replica of Greater Chicago that has 16 trains of its own, a



drive-in movie theatre, and other transit-related exhibits like elevated trains and subway trains. Down to business: Though Silets (left) has plenty of personal passion for her trains, they are also her business. Huff & Puff Industries (right) creations have appeared in Chicago's Hancock Center, Tiffany's window displays, and on the Oprah Winfrey Show, The Today Show, NBC, CNN, CBS, FOX, NBC, the Travel Channel, and PBS.

For visitors, the once a year opportunity was well worth the \$10 entrance fee. It was fun, young Ethan Sparks told the Barrington Courier-Review as he reluctantly stepped off a replica Hogwarts Express train, inspired by the Harry Potter film and book series. Visitors continually thanked Silets for inviting the public onto her estate. 'I always feel like Oueen Elizabeth for a day,' Silets said. She even offered tips on how to create one's own Glorée & Tryumfant Garden. I tell everyone it's real easy,' she said. 'All you need is to live here 40-plus years, and have buckets of money. I've lived here 44 years now, Silets clarified. There was almost nothing here — the pond was here and a shabby, 1,000-square-foot house. And no matter how much her home and gardens are appreciated by visitors, Silets seems to love it all the most. I live in heaven, she said. I do. Isn't it beautiful?
