### Hi End Railroading 120.3 Fn 3


Most of us Garden railroaders that play with trains are affectionately known as G-scalers. This coined term is used vaguely to cover all sizes in large scale. Some would disagree. Recently, the largest growth in large scale trains has occurred in the 1:20.3 scale product offering. More manufacturers are jumping into this scale that uses the same 64mm G-scale track. The trains are bigger but the attention to detail is tremendous. Most of us don't care how many rivets are on a car or engine; just as long as it looks good. However, some do and expect the models to be the correct length, width and height as well as the track to be perfect to scale as well. Accucraft has been producing Fn3 scale models for years along with a hand full of other such as Berlyn and RY models(Rich Yoder). Bachmann even made a commitment 2 years ago and is continuing to offer scale cars as well as the highly successful D&RGW K-27 loco. These products cost a lot more but for the true enthusiasts, this is their only option short of 'scratch-built.' It's all in the details with the goal being to create a miniature version of what we have in real life.

Recently I was fortunate enough to be invited to the RGS East fall open house over in White Hall MD. This was the first time I could make it in 2 years. Roger Cutter is well known in the train industry for superb models, designs and engineering. He and his friends were great hosts and we enjoyed discussing our passions for trains.

Most of the trains are scale 1:20.3 and battery powered as there is no track power on this layout. I saw some of the best hand built rolling stock I have ever seen. Track is primarily aluminum code-250 with 2 main lines. There are over 16 sidings for setting out cars and allowing overtaking trains to pass. They run anywhere from 3-5 trains at a time.

These scaler's normally run narrow gauge featuring the Denver & RioGrande and we did see plenty of those trains. As it turned out, the focus of the day was EBT equipment and I saw more of that in one place than ever before. It was really entertaining to see exact replicas of trains and there consists as the existed back "in the day." The only negative to this is the costs involved to move up to this level of model railroading. It's triple or more the costs up front. The funny thing is in a down economy, this section of the hobby is still flourishing. Go Figure!
