

Turk has made the arrangements for this show. Setup with be on Thursday May 8th at 10am till whenever. All other materials will be provided by Executive Landscaping/Colonial Gardens. A logging display will also be included. Our layout size is approx. 12' x 20'.

The evening wrapped up with a slide show presentation by Kirk Slenker detailing the move of his layout to a new location and much of the building and space prep. Kirk has done a wonderful job and continues to give back to his community and the community's youth with this endeavor.














2024 Rocky Ridge Christmas Magic round up

I want to start this year's round up with a few major thank you's. Thanks to my wife for supporting me, to our VP for being present and learning more of the ropes. To Dee for taking on most of the communication and for Turk troubleshooting several issues over the course of the event especially when I was unavailable.

The 2023 Rocky Ridge season started with the trailer repack held at the National Apple Museum where the club now stores the trailer and additional items. This was held on Sunday October 6th from 2:00-4:00pm. We had nine folks present with Turk and Penny taking the lead on sorting and repacking much of the Rocky Ridge display items.

This year's Rocky Ridge Pre-setup was held Monday November 4th from 10:00am till 2:30pm. We had four workers attending and we succeeded in getting the platforms set and fastened together, closing in and insulating the barn door, and setting the track loop for Thomas and the main Christmas Tree. This time we also put down, shimmed and secured all the track loops, inside and out!

The main setup day fell on Saturday November 16^{th,} and we were able to take the chill off with the park service heaters. Dee and Bill Simmons and Mary Jane Reiff provided refreshments. That was greatly appreciated by all! Although we had a slightly smaller than expected crew of 18 members their families, we were able to complete the bulk of the setup between 10am and 4:00pm.

As in 2023 the Park Service stepped up and made the full payment in advance which was increased by \$200.00 this year. The 2024 calendar afforded us just 30 run days between Thanksgiving and New Year's Eve, but as mentioned we also had six days of closure due to weather leaving us only 24 days to build on the base payment with donations and raffle. A full financial report will be made at the March meeting.

With just 24 days open, overall attendance was roughly 10,000 less guests compared to 2023 with a total of 36,952 attending according to the park service. This was a big factor in our bottom line.

As we've done for a few years now, seven trains ran on the layout, which along with the revamped amusement park, is a lot of motion. A new smaller roller coaster, Round Up and Rocket ride performed well during the show.

New items this year was a Whoville provided by Dee and Penny and a rotating base for Hogwarts castle provided by Barry McNew. We also implemented a recommendation which popped up at the picnic in the form of a back-and-forth train on a shelf behind the relocated raffle table.

Kudos to Dee for pressing everyone to start the signup process at the club picnic. The Bachmann C-19 Consolidation and the USA-Trains GP30 (with Rob's matched GP30) started the show, but we then subbed in the F3 A/B set about halfway through. Turk and Barry will be performing maintenance, and all the engines will be serviced through the winter and this spring.

Tear down saw another reasonably mild day for the 23 helpers on January 11th insuring we got cleaned up and packed up in record time. The "found" coins on clean-up day was a nice bonus of \$135.97 along with another \$48.97 from the pond.

Raffle Roundup: This year raffle chances were way down for a total of 578 tickets sold. I must give a shout out to Turk for once again convincing Bachmann to send us this a train set for free meaning that was all profit! This year's winner was Kayla Miller from Thomasville Pa. I hope all our monitors got to see and enjoy the happy faces!



Thanks, from myself, Bob and Dee for another successful event!



























