












Rocky Ridge Round Up

For anyone who has never had the privilege of visiting Providence Junction, Kevin has several scratch-built structures that provide a great atmosphere in his garden.
























McNew Family Trip

While we were in Scranton, we visited Steamtown.





























Entertrainment Junction

Unfortunately, the business will be closing down some time in January of 2025. It will be open until that time and is worth the trip to see.




























Videos and Websites




